Roselle V. Fairchild, age 92 of Batesville, died Sunday, November 25, 2012 at Margaret Mary Hospital in Batesville. Born January 16, 1920 in South Bend, Indiana, she is the daughter of Rose (Nee: Papai) and Harry Fritz. She married Frank Fairchild August 12, 1939 in South Bend, Indiana and he preceded her in death February 3, 2005. Roselle spent many years collecting dolls and amassed quite an impressive collection that she was extremely proud of and certainly was her pride and joy. She had several other interests as well. One that made her family chuckle was her devotion to her soap operas. Weekday afternoons were spent watching the block of soaps that CBS aired. She also liked to go shopping and while not necessarily his favorite thing to do; Frank would take her since she didn't drive. In addition to not driving, another interesting side note, to her family's knowledge, she never wrote a check in her lifetime, something rare, especially in this day and age.
