Linnie Sue Williams, age 52 of Batesville, Indiana, died Tuesday, February 20, 2007 at the Indiana University Medical Center in Indianapolis. Born August 12, 1954 in Springfield, Ohio, she is the daughter of Juanita (Nee: Combs) and Arnold Perkins. She married Mark S. Williams on September 17, 1977 in Dayton, Ohio. Linnie was an Executive's Assistant for the Guidant Corporation in Indianapolis and was a member of PAAIN (People Assisting Animals in Need) and ALDA (American Late Deafened Adults).
