Juliana K. Huser, age 99 of Enochsburg, died Tuesday, May 12, 2020 at Margaret Mary Health. The daughter of Elizabeth (Nee: Litmer) and Frederick Huser, she was born May 8, 1921 at home in Franklin County Indiana, where she lived her entire life. A nurse at Decatur County Hospital 40 years, she served as the Director of Nursing.

Her family described her as a home body who took pride in keeping a neat and tidy house and yard and enjoyed working in her flower beds. She was also an avid sports fan and although she rooted for I.U. and the Reds, she liked watching and discussing all sports with other fans. Quiet time would find her working word search puzzles, but what she loved most was time spent with her family.

She is survived by numerous nieces and nephews. In addition to her parents, she is also preceded in death by brothers Albert, Urban, Lawrence and Arthur Huser. Juliana's wishes were to be cremated. 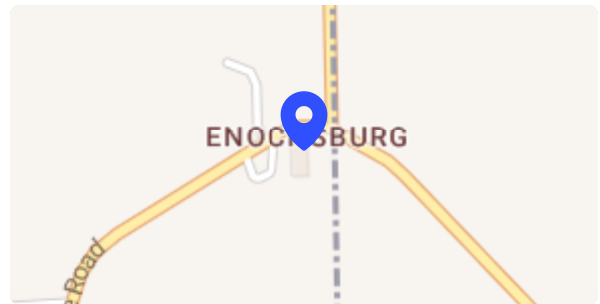

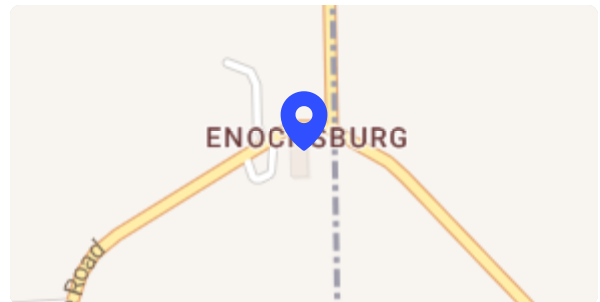
