Dot had a loved for crafts and for nearly fifteen years owned Dot's Craft Store. 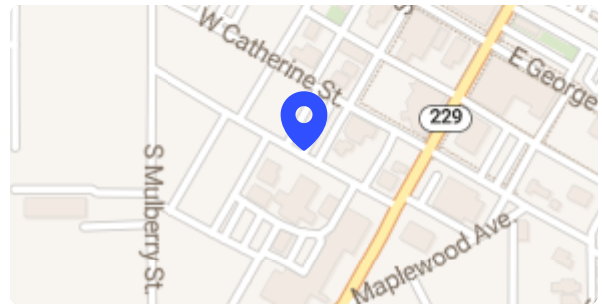
